Founded in the early years of the second world war to raise money for war charities, the Birmingham Philharmonic Orchestra received its present title in 1941. It retained its vigour at the cessation of hostilities and remains one of the country's leading large non-professional symphony orchestras, drawing its members from all walks of life throughout the West Midlands. For most of its members music is a form of relaxation, but for others it is a stepping stone in their musical careers.

The orchestra has been based at the Birmingham Conservatoire since 1993. It rehearses there on Sundays between September and June, giving concerts every 7-8 weeks in the Conservatoire's Adrian Boult Hall. Six or seven concerts a year are given at other venues in the West Midlands. The BPO has also performed regularly at Symphony Hall and Town Hall Birmingham as well as some of England's great cathedrals, and has been a mainstay of the Leominster Festival since its inception in 1980. Michael Lloyd Music Director

Michael Lloyd first conducted the Birmingham Philharmonic Orchestra in 1985 and became Music Director and Principal Conductor in 1994. Born in Worcestershire, he studied at the Birmingham School of Music, the University of East Anglia and the Royal College of Music. His conducting career has encompassed opera, ballet, symphony



concerts and West End musicals. Michael teaches regularly in the opera schools of the Royal College of Music and the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and was an Advisor to the OperaGenesis programme at the Royal Opera House for the duration of its existence from 2006-2009.

From September 2009 - January 2010 Michael was engaged at the Opera House in Magdeburg, Germany, for a new production of "Orpheus in the Underworld" and a variety of ballets. He has now been appointed Principal Guest Conductor there.

Michael is also the Music Director of Chandos Symphony Orchestra, Malvern.
