> PURPOSE OF MAKING MUSIC TO THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE STANDARD. IT REMAINS ONE OF THE COUNTRY'S LEADING AMATEUR SYMPHONY ORCHESTRAS.

IT IS A LARGE ORCHESTRA OF 86 REGULAR PLAYERS, WHICH TAKES AS ITS CORE REPERTOIRE THE MAJOR SYMPHONIC COMPOSITIONS OF THE LATE 19TH AND EARLY 20TH CENTURY. THE ORCHESTRA WORKS UNDER THE LEADERSHIP OF PROFESSIONAL MUSICIANS LIKE MICHAEL SEAL AND BYRON PARISH (NOW IN THEIR FIFTH SEASON AS CO-LEADERS) AND ITS MUSIC DIRECTOR, MICHAEL LLOYD, AND DRAWS ITS MEMBERS FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE THROUGHOUT THE WEST MIDLANDS.

THE ORCHESTRA IS BASED AT THE BIRMINGHAM CONSERVATOIRE WHERE IT REHEARSES ON SUNDAYS BETWEEN SEPTEMBER AND JUNE. REGULAR CONCERTS ARE GIVEN EVERY 7-9 WEEKS IN THE CONSERVATOIRE'S ADRIAN BOULT HALL. ADDITIONAL CONCERTS ARE GIVEN AT OTHER VENUES IN THE WEST MIDLANDS.

THREE OF THE ORCHESTRA MEMBERS APPEAR "IN FRONT" OF THE ORCHESTRA THIS SEASON: MIKE WILD PLAYING THE HORN & CLAIRE HUMPHREYS SINGING FOR OUR EVER-SUCCESSFUL VIENNESE EVENINGS, WHICH ARE ONCE AGAIN CONDUCTED BY JOHN FRANKLIN (USUALLY PRINCIPAL FLUTE). IN ADDITION TO THIS MICHAEL SEAL - WHO FREQUENTLY LEADS THE ORCHESTRA - WILL PERFORM THE KORNGOLD VIOLIN CONCERTO IN FEBRUARY.



MICHARL LLOYD WAS APPOINTED MUSIC DIRECTOR AND CHIEF CONDUCTOR OF THE BIRMINGHAM PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA IN MARCH 1994 AFTER SEVERAL YEARS OF ACTIVE ASSOCIATION AS A GUEST CONDUCTOR. HE IS A NATIVE OF WORCESTERSHIRE AND READ MUSIC AT THE UNIVERSITY OF EAST ANGLIA IN NORWICH, FOLLOWED BY FURTHER STUDY AT THE ROYAL COLLEGE OF MUSIC IN LONDON. HE JOINED SCOTTISH BALLET AS COMPANY PIANIST AND IT WAS WITH THIS COMPANY

> THAT HE BEGAN CONDUCTING BALLETS. IN 1972 MICHAEL IOINED THE STAATSTHEATER KASSEL, INITIALLY AS BALLET CONDUCTOR AND PIANIST, BUT AFTER ONLY ONE SEASON WAS OFFERED A POST ON THE OPERA STAFF AND MADE HIS OPERA DEBUT THERE. IN 1980 MICHAEL LLOYD MOVED TO STUTTGART WHERE HE CONTINUED HIS OPERATIC CONDUCTING AND WORKED REGULARLY WITH LOCAL CHORAL

AND ORCHESTRAL ENSEMBLES.

IN 1985 MICHAEL LLOYD JOINED THE MUSIC STAFF AT ENGLISH NATIONAL OPERA WHERE HE HAS CONDUCTED REGULARLY AT THE COLISEUM AND ON TOUR. OUTSIDE THE COLISEUM. MICHAEL HAS CONDUCTED IN JAPAN, KOREA AND NEW ZEALAND AND HAS PARTICIPATED IN A WIDE RANGE OF CONCERTS IN LONDON WHERE HE ALSO TEACHES REGULARLY AT THE OPERA SCHOOL OF THE RCM. SINCE MICHAEL'S APPOINTMENT HERE HE HAS VERY SUCCESSFULLY PERFORMED MANY MAJOR WORKS WITH THE BPO, AND THIS SEASON'S PROGRAMMING CONTINUES TO OFFER CHALLENGING AND EXCITING MUSIC. IN ADDITION TO HIS BPO ROLE, MICHAEL LLOYD IS ALSO THE MUSIC DIRECTOR AND PRINCIPAL CONDUCTOR OF THE CHANDOS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA, MALVERN.

MARTIN WEST



BORN IN BOLTON, LANCASHIRE, MARTIN WEST READ MATHS AT ST. CATHERINE'S COLLEGE, CAMBRIDGE, HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL YOUTH ORCHESTRA AND STARTED CONDUCTING AT UNIVERSITY. HE SUBSEQUENTLY STUDIED AT THE ROYAL ACADEMY OF MUSIC WITH COLIN METTERS, GEORGE HURST AND SIR COLIN DAVIS AND AT THE ST. PETERSBURG CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC UNDER THE LEGENDARY PEDAGOGUE ILYA MUSIN, WHILST AT THE ACADEMY HE

WAS AWARDED NUMEROUS SCHOLARSHIPS AND PRIZES INCLUDING THE HENRY WOOD CONDUCTING SCHOLARSHIP AND THE ERNEST READ PRIZE FOR BEST STUDENT CONDUCTOR. IN NOVEMBER 1995 HE WAS RUNNER-UP IN THE BRITISH RESERVE NAYO CONDUCTING COMPETITION.

IN THE AUTUMN OF 1997 HE MADE HIS DEBUT WITH ENGLISH NATIONAL BALLET AND WAS SUBSEQUENTLY APPOINTED ASSISTANT CONDUCTOR AND NOW CONDUCTS OVER FIFTY PERFORMANCES A YEAR WITH THAT COMPANY. HE HAS ALSO WORKED WITH PIMLICO OPERA, BLOOMSBURY OPERA, THE ORCHESTRA DEL TEATRO MASSIMO, PALERMO, BOURNEMOUTH SINFONIETTA, SINFONIA 21 AND CONDUCTED THE LONDON SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA IN A MASTERCLASS WITH PIERRE BOULEZ. HE WAS THE CONDUCTOR OF THE HOUNSLOW SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA FROM 1993-98 AND IN SEPTEMBER THIS YEAR TOOK UP THE POST OF CONDUCTOR OF THE CAMBRIDGE PHILHARMONIC SOCIETY, MARTIN HAS ALSO TAUGHT CONDUCTING AT THE GUILDHALL SCHOOL OF MUSIC IUNIOR DEPARTMENT AND AT THE NATIONAL FILM AND TELEVISION SCHOOL, HE MADE HIS DEBUT WITH THE BIRMINGHAM PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA IN DECEMBER 1996. SINCE 1995 MARTIN WEST'S CAREER HAS BEEN FOLLOWED BY BBC RADIO 4 FOR A DOCUMENTARY DUE TO BE BROADCAST IN 1999.
